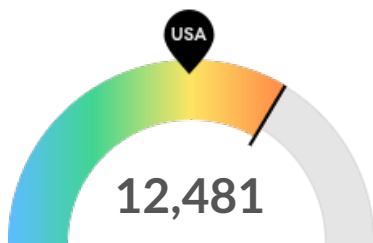

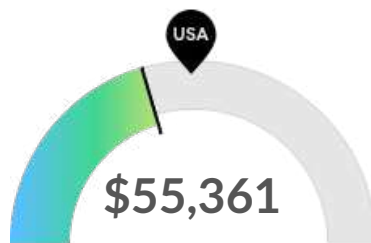

### Aggressive Job Posting Demand Over a Deep Supply of Regional Jobs



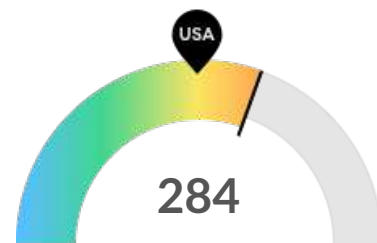
**Jobs (2023)**

**Job Posting Demand**

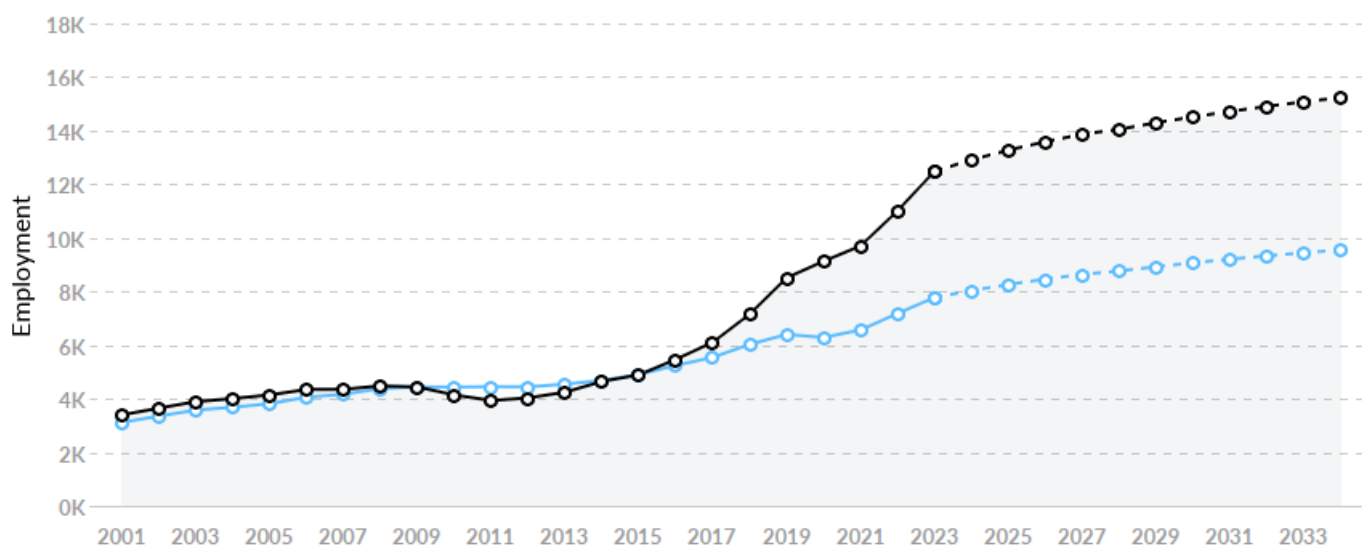
Job posting activity is high in San Diego-Chula Vista-Carlsbad, CA. The national average for an area this size is 209\* job postings/mo, while there are 284 here.

## Regional Employment Is Higher Than the National Average

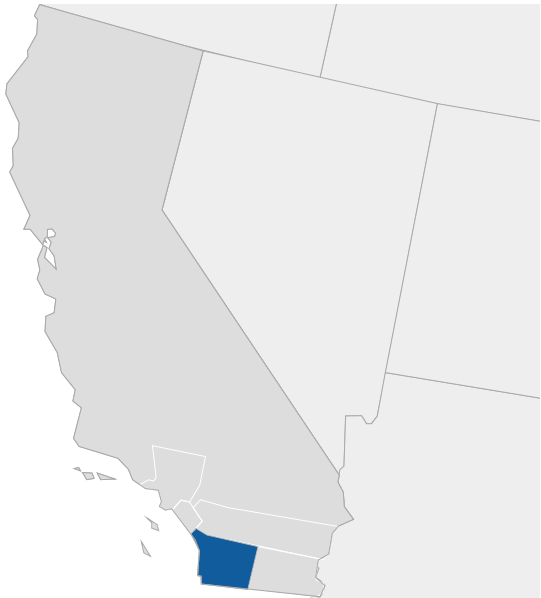

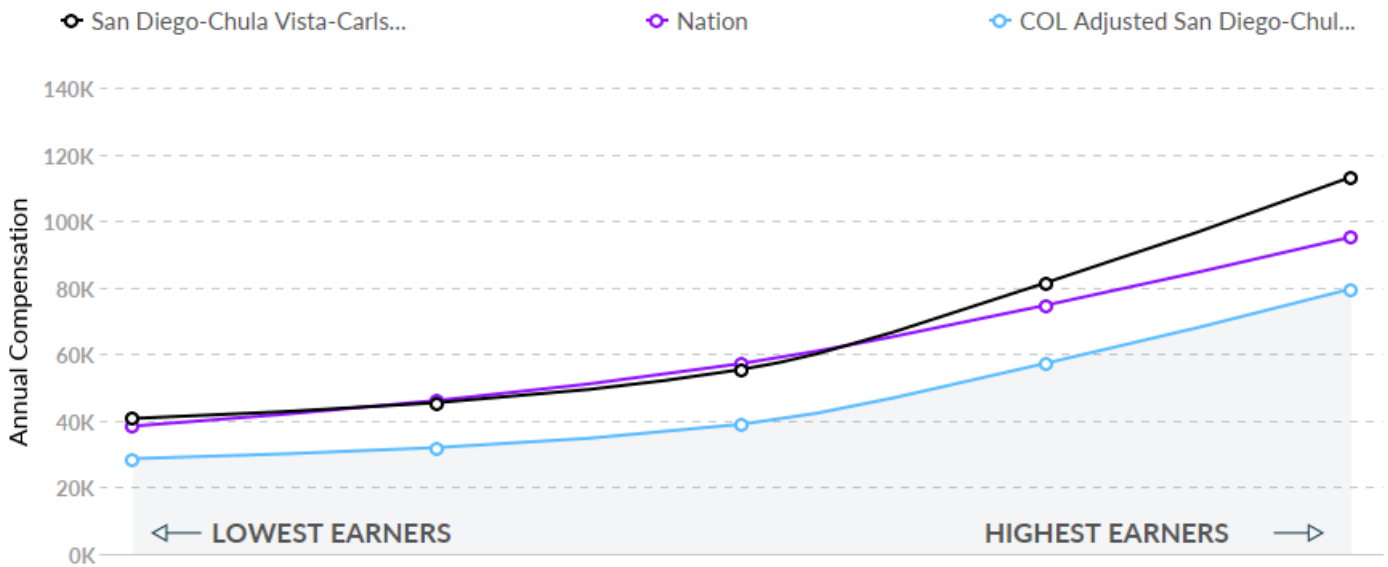
### Most Jobs are Found in the Individual and Family Services Industry Sector

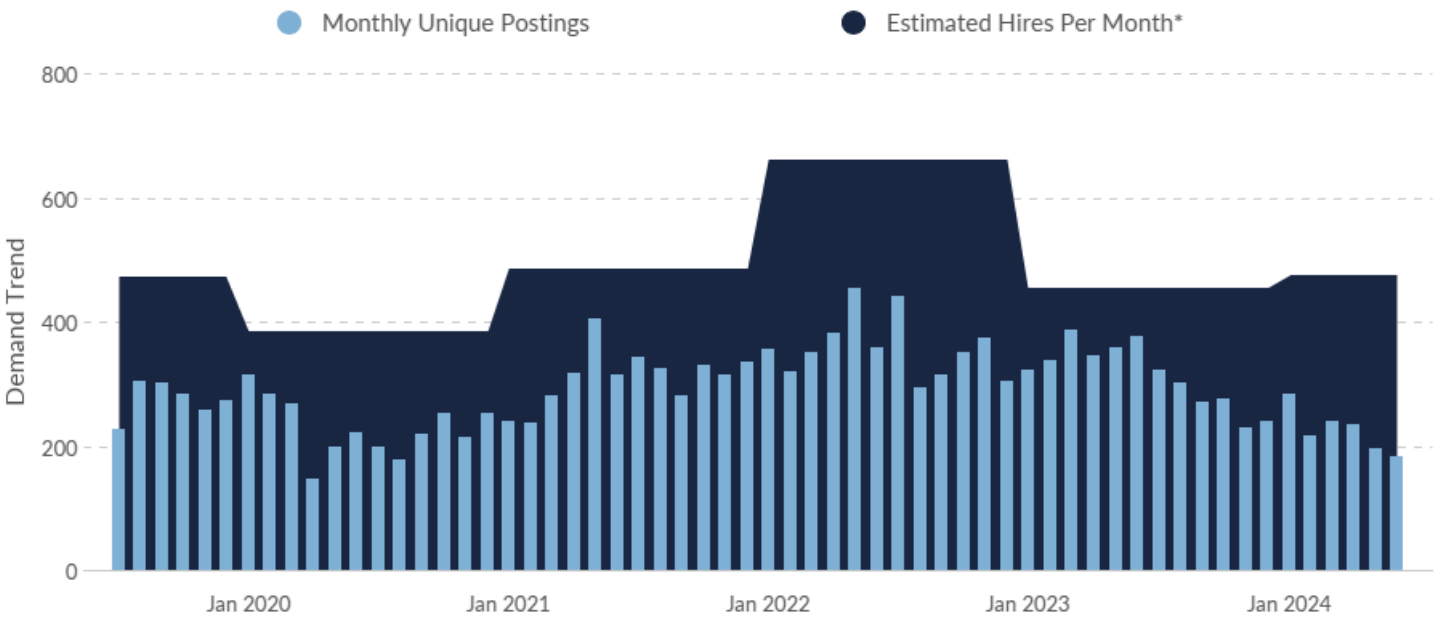

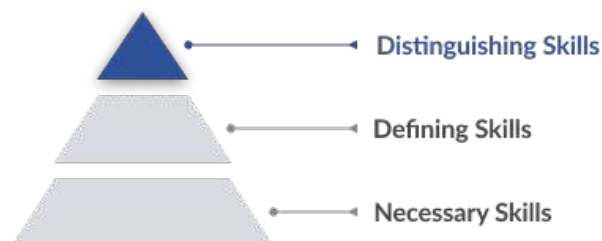

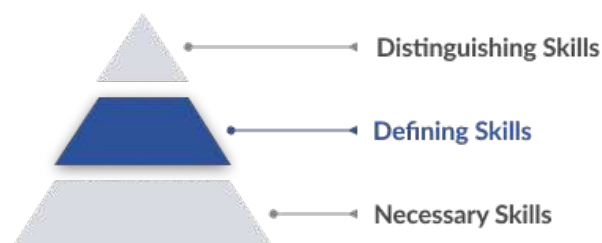

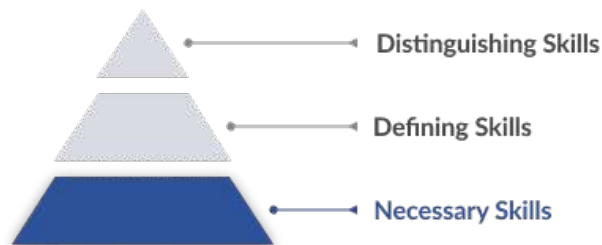

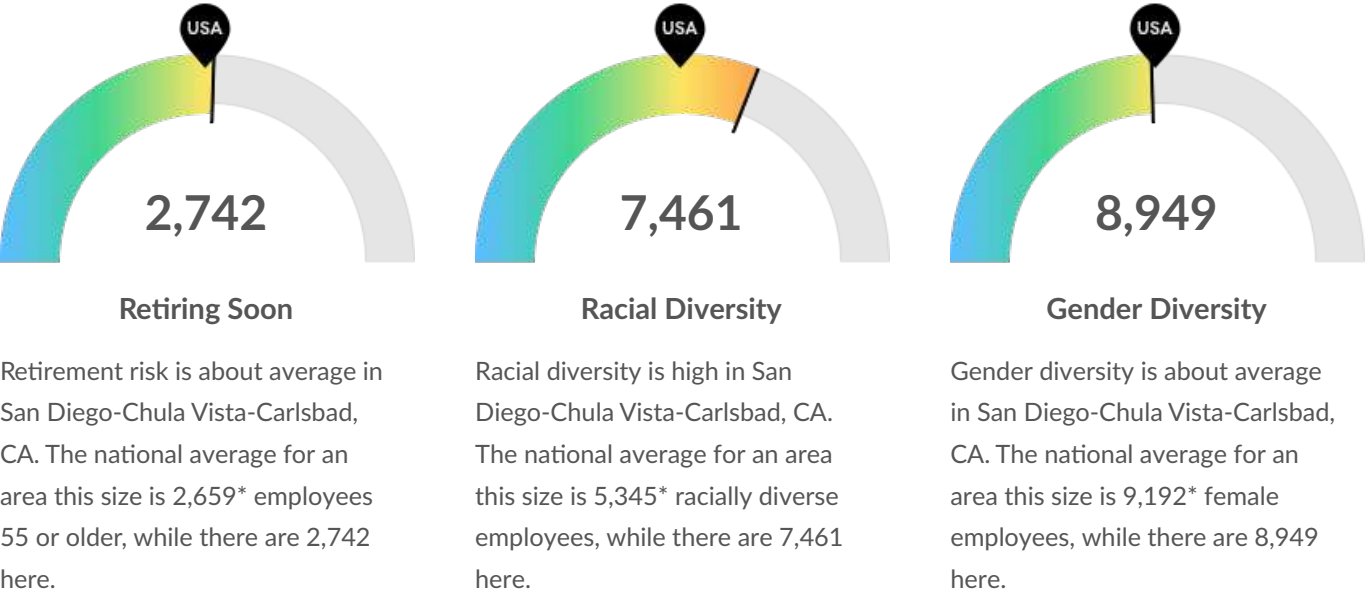

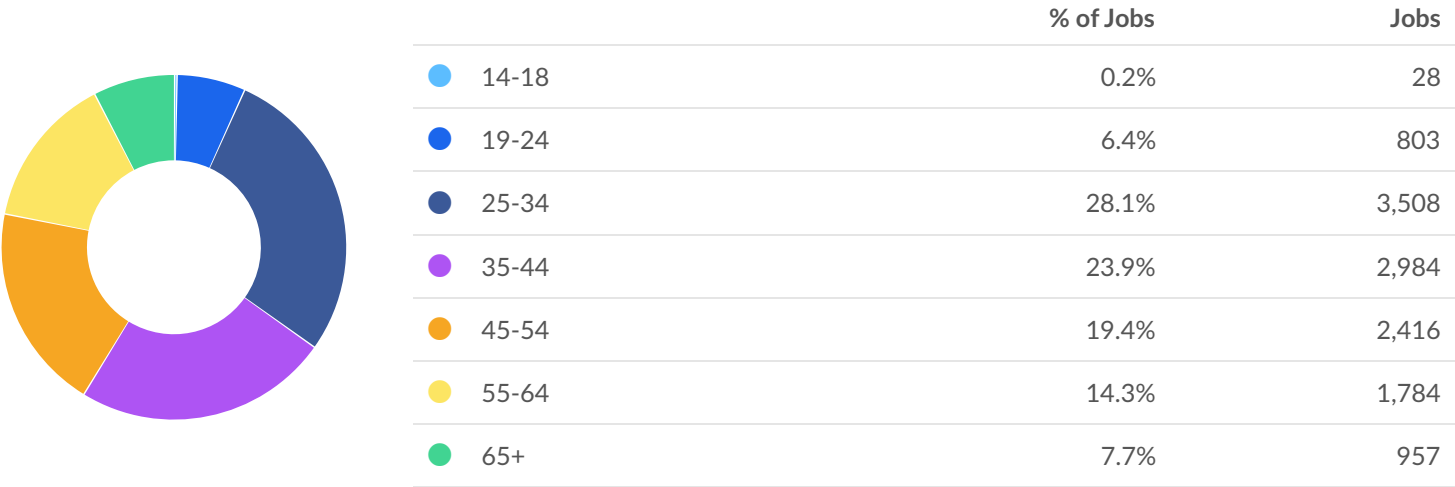

## Retirement Risk Is About Average, While Overall Diversity Is High

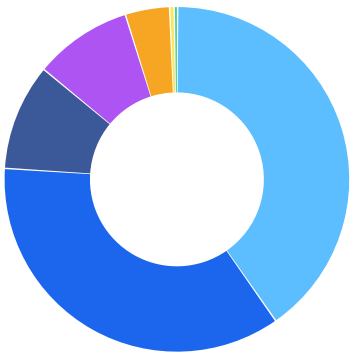

## Occupation Age Breakdown

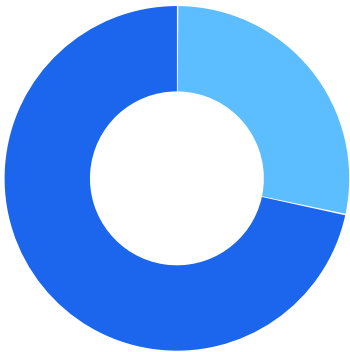

## Appendix A - Data Sources and Calculations

### Location Quotient

Location quotient (LQ) is a way of quantifying how concentrated a particular industry, cluster, occupation, or demographic group is in a region as compared to the nation. It can reveal what makes a particular region unique in comparison to the national average.

### Occupation Data

Emsi occupation employment data are based on final Emsi industry data and final Emsi staffing patterns. Wage estimates are based on Occupational Employment Statistics (QCEW and Non-QCEW Employees classes of worker) and the American Community Survey (Self-Employed and Extended Proprietors). Occupational wage estimates are also affected by county-level Emsi earnings by industry.

### Staffing Patterns Data

The staffing pattern data in this report are compiled from several sources using a specialized process. For QCEW and Non-QCEW Employees classes of worker, sources include Occupational Employment Statistics, the National Industry-Occupation Employment Matrix, and the American Community Survey. For the Self-Employed and Extended Proprietors classes of worker, the primary source is the American Community Survey, with a small amount of information from Occupational Employment Statistics.

### Cost of Living Data

Lightcast's cost of living data is based on the Cost of Living Index published by the Council for Community and Economic Research (C2ER).

### Lightcast Job Postings

Job postings are collected from various sources and processed/enriched to provide information such as standardized company name, occupation, skills, and geography.

### Institution Data

The institution data in this report is taken directly from the national IPEDS database published by the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics.
